
Department of Public Safety Community Survey 2021

35% were familiar with DPS programs prior to taking the survey


Safewalk and Property Registration had the highest levels of overall participation.



Very Safe | Somewhat Safe | Neither Safe or Unsafe | Somewhat Unsafe | Very Unsafe






Respondents reported a variety of accommodations would make them feel safer, but overall increased lighting and increased access to transportation were most important.

Do the security guards in neon yellow jackets make you feel safe?








How would you rate the attitudes/behaviors of officers toward members of the Brown Community?

Which of the following best describes your primary role in the Brown community?


About half of respondents were faculty/staff. The other half of respondents were students, with undergraduates representing the largest portion.



Notes on Demographics:

Grand Totals for demographic categories may not equal total number of all respondents due to unreported items.

Historically Underrepresented Group (HUG) is a term used for racial/ethnic groups that have been historically underrepresented in higher education. HUG includes those who identify as: American Indian or Alaska Native, Black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, and/or Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. For the purposes of survey analysis, individuals who selected more than one race/ethnicity were categorized into one of two groups. Respondents were categorized as Multiracial-HUG if they reported more than one race/ethnicity category and at least one of those race/ethnicity were within HUG. Respondents were categorized as Multiracial-Non-HUG if they reported more than one race/ethnicity category with none of those categories within HUG.
