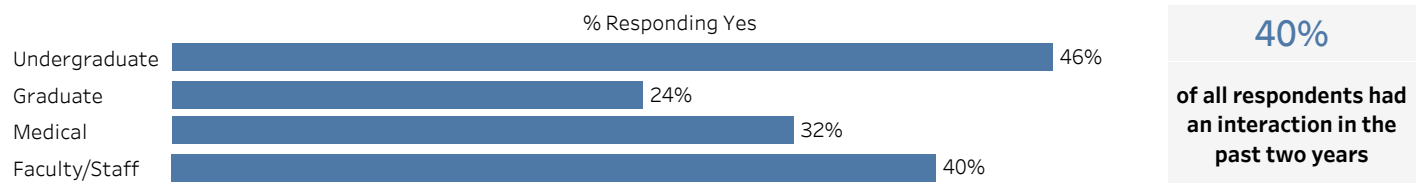


# Department of Public Safety Community Survey 2021

Brown's Department of Public Safety (DPS), as part of its self-assessment and reaccreditation process, administered a survey to get a sense of how they were serving the community. This report shows the responses by population.

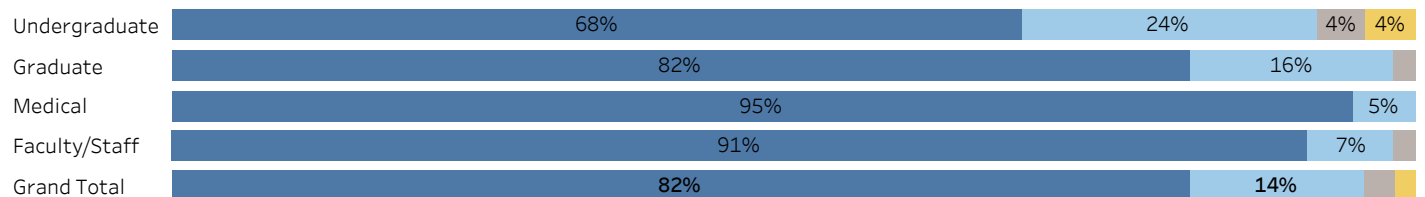
92% of all respondents reported being satisfied with the response and/or service rendered

92% of all respondents reported being given a clear explanation about what was happening

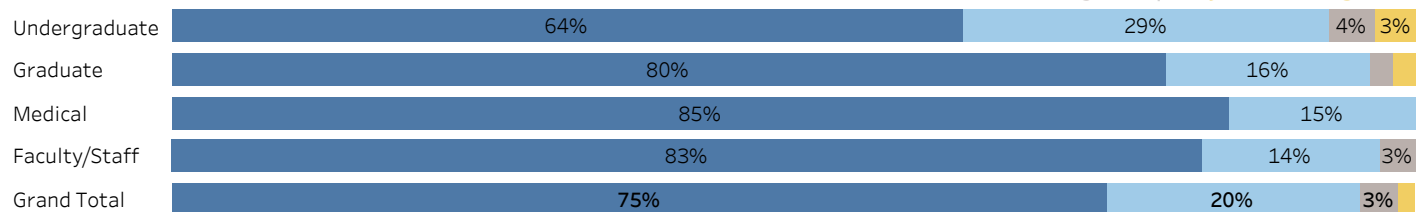
How would you rate the level of professionalism you were shown?

Very Professional | Somewhat Professional | Somewhat Unprofessional | Very Unprofessional



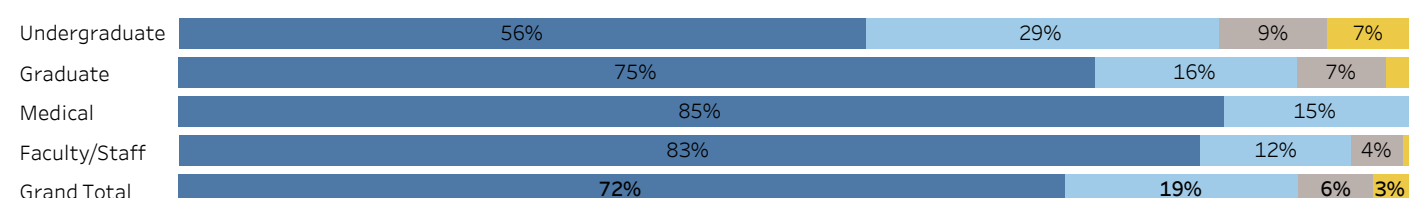
How knowledgeable was this person?

**35%** were familiar with DPS programs prior to taking the survey

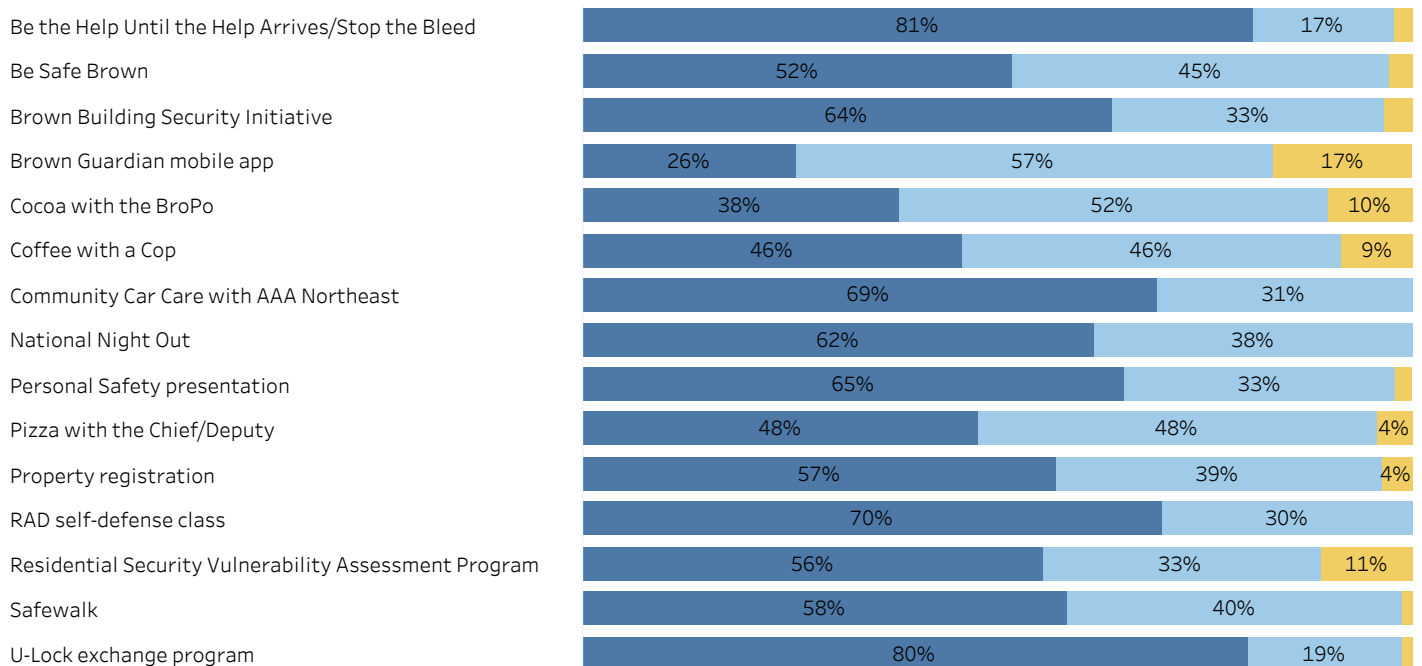

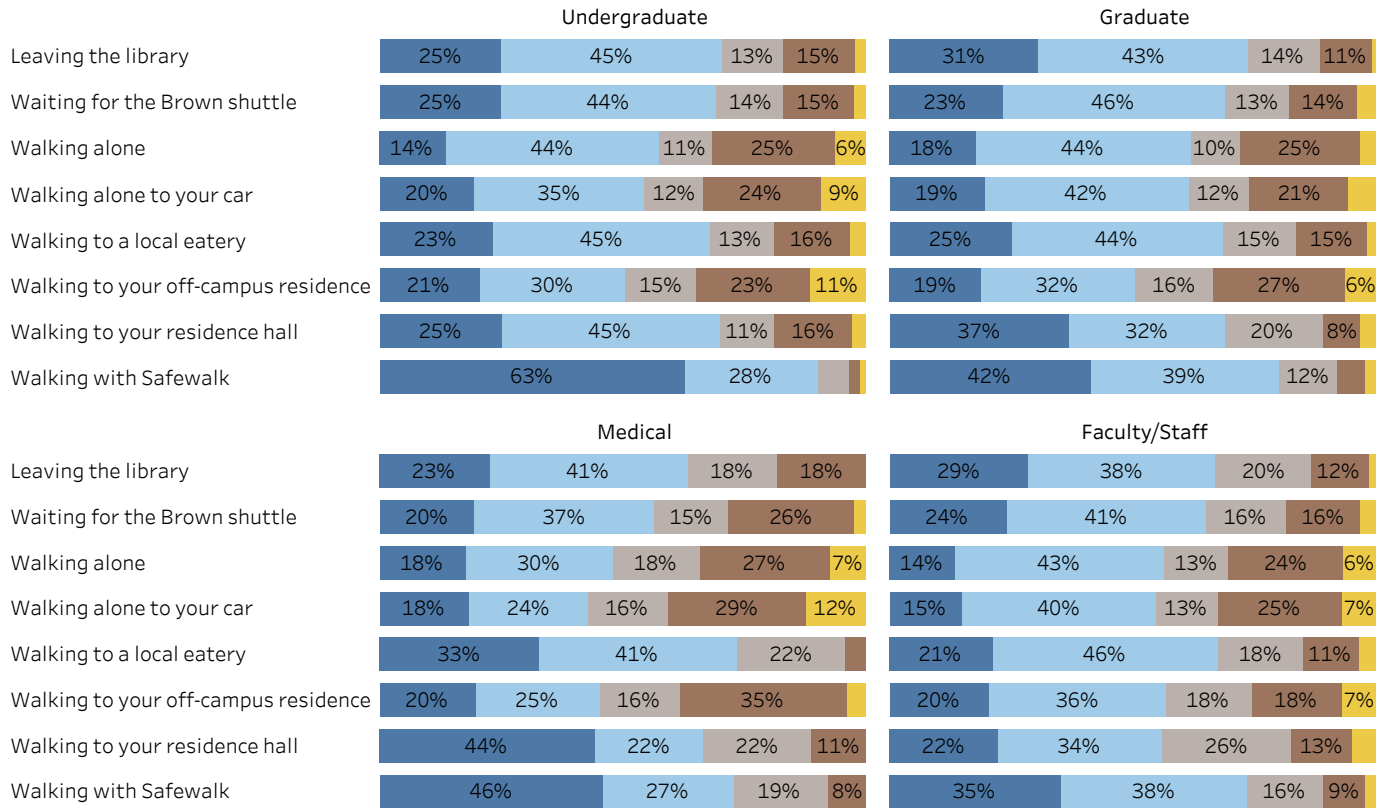

Very Safe | Somewhat Safe | Neither Safe or Unsafe | Somewhat Unsafe | Very Unsafe



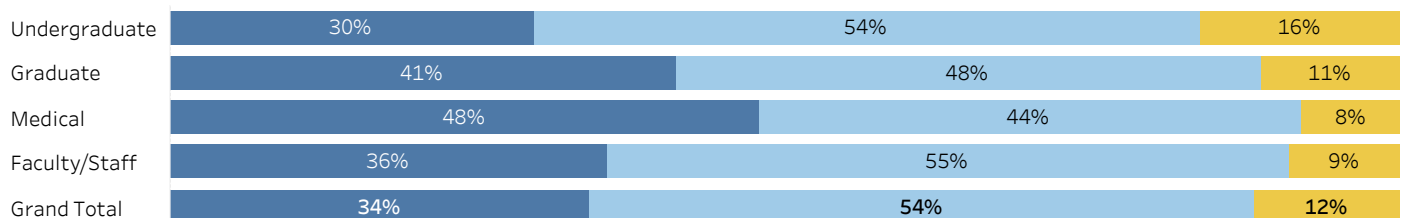
## What would make you feel safer?

Respondents reported a variety of accommodations would make them feel safer, but overall increased lighting and increased access to transportation were most important.

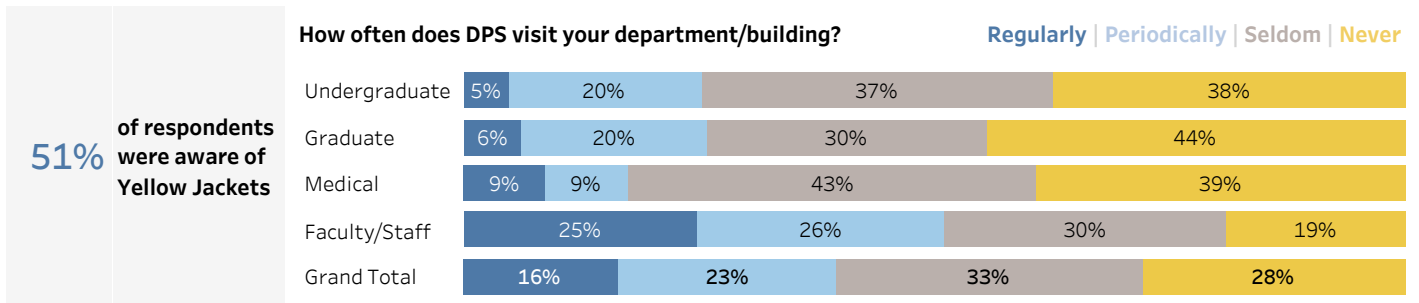

## Do the security guards in neon yellow jackets make you feel safe?

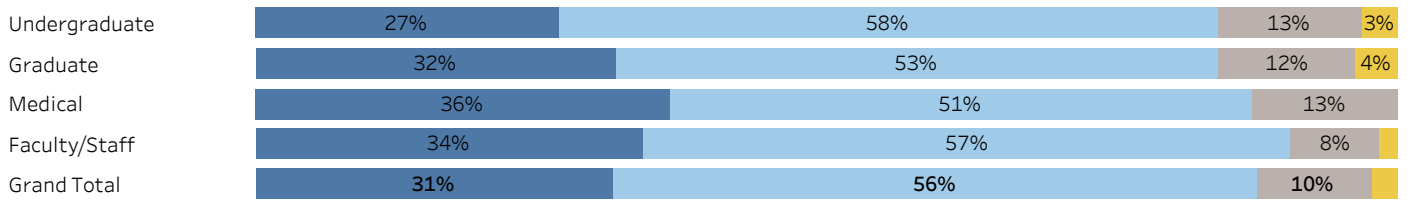

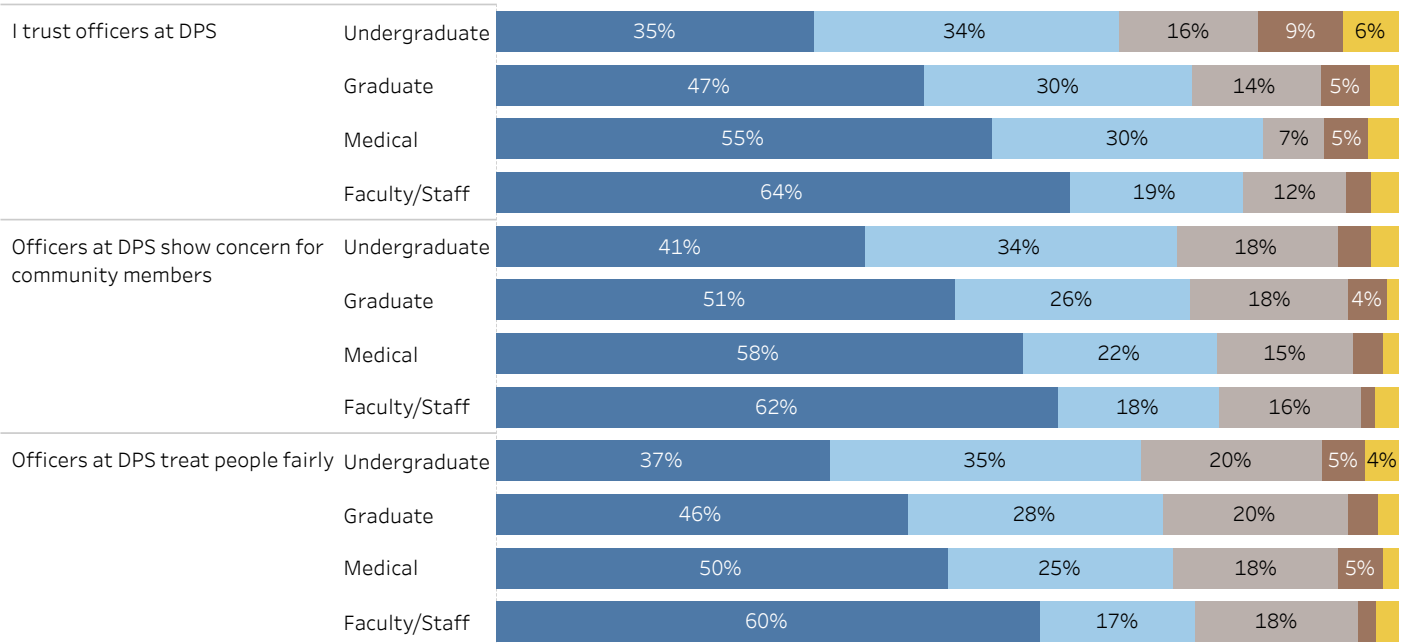

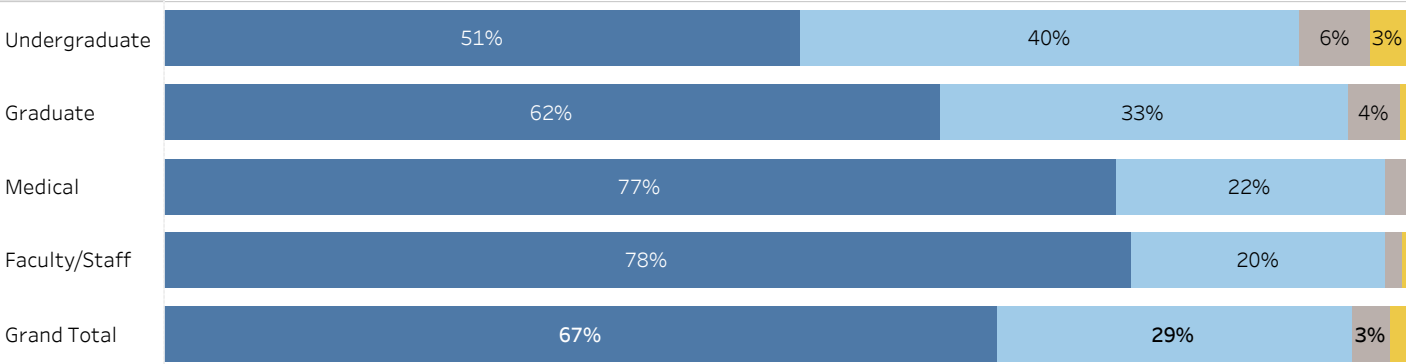
**77%** of all respondents agreed they trust officers at DPS

**75%** of all respondents agreed officers at DPS treat people fairly

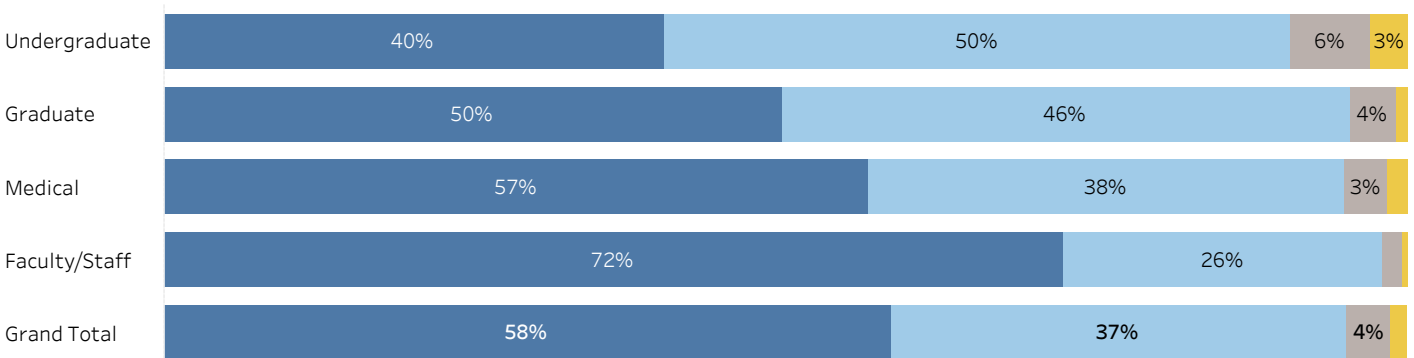
How would you rate the attitudes/behaviors of officers toward members of the Brown Community?

Very competent | Somewhat Competent | Somewhat Incompetent | Very Incompetent

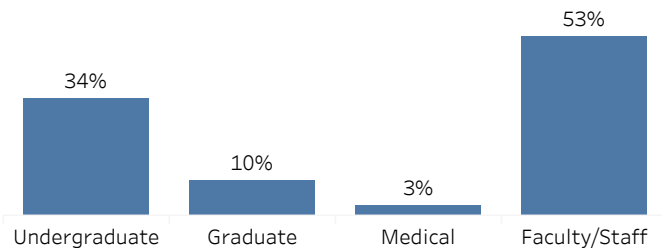


## Respondent Demographics

About half of respondents were faculty/staff. The other half of respondents were students, with undergraduates representing the largest portion.

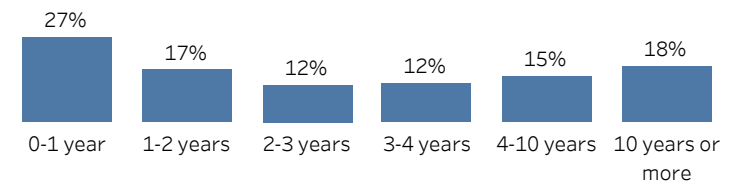

Over one quarter of respondents reported being part of the Brown community for less than 1 year. The remaining respondents were distributed similarly amongst other groups.

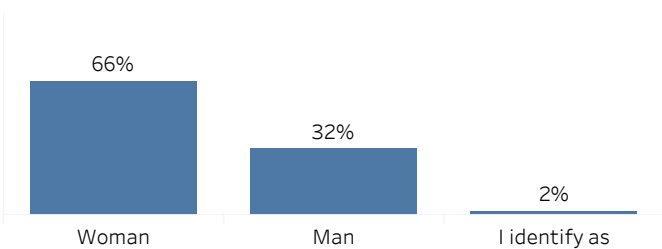

Women represented two-thirds of respondents.

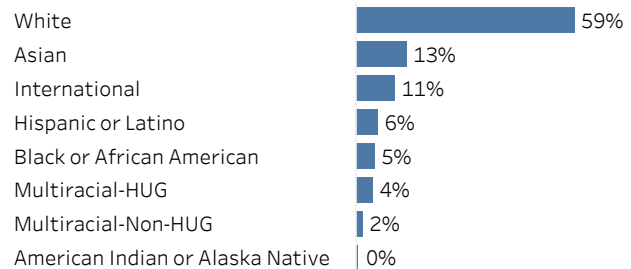

### Notes on Demographics:

Grand Totals for demographic categories may not equal total number of all respondents due to unreported items.

**Historically Underrepresented Group (HUG)** is a term used for racial/ethnic groups that have been historically underrepresented in higher education. HUG includes those who identify as: American Indian or Alaska Native, Black or African American, Hispanic or Latino, and/or Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. For the purposes of survey analysis, individuals who selected more than one race/ethnicity were categorized into one of two groups. Respondents were categorized as **Multiracial-HUG** if they reported more than one race/ethnicity category and at least one of those race/ethnicity were within HUG. Respondents were categorized as **Multiracial-Non-HUG** if they reported more than one race/ethnicity category with none of those categories within HUG.
